Krispin Blueway Grand Opening

We opened the Krispin Blueways trail last month with about 70 Kayakers paddling from the North Channel to Muscamoot Bay. All the profits went to the St. Clair Flats Wildlife Area. The Krispin Blueway has about 11 miles of trails. We put up signage marking the routes and have maps available. Also paddlers can dine at the school house for a great break. Paddling through the Flats Wildlife area is available till the end of August, it closes for hunting season. Also you can walk on the miles of dykes in the wildlife area, the amount of wildlife and birds you will see is amazing.

NO WAKE 200/600 FOOT RULE

Just a reminder, there is no wake for boats 26 feet and longer, 600 feet from shore or a dock. All boats should be at no wake speeds 200 feet off of a dock or shore. Have fun but stay safe on the water.
